

## **ABF Leader**

### **I. GOALS:**

To help generate and maintain the community within the ABF. Lead by delegating most of the tasks (care, assimilation, service, socials and the ABF hour) so that the ABF teacher may focus primarily on teaching.

### **II. REQUIREMENTS:**

- A. Be an active, growing Christian.
- B. Be a member or in the process of becoming a member of The Chapel.
- C. Be active in the ABF.
- D. Sign the Covenant of Ministry.
- E. Willing to fulfill the ministry description.
- F. Regular Sunday service attendance.

### **III. APPOINTMENT:**

By ABF Teacher with approval of your ABF Pastor.

### **IV. RESPONSIBLE TO:**

ABF Teacher and your ABF Pastor.

### **V. TERM OF MINISTRY:**

Two years, or longer, if willing.

### **VI. ABF CLASS LEADER RESPONSIBILITIES:**

- A. Together with the ABF Teacher set the vision for the ABF.
- B. Delegate the jobs necessary to carry out the vision. These include: care, relational needs, assimilation, ABF roster, prayer, service projects, missional emphasis, socials, and mood in the ABF hour.
- C. Participate in the Community Forums and other training events.
- D. Connect with the ABF's Pastor by encouraging him to visit/participate. Get together with the Pastor to set strategy for the ABF three times a year.
- E. Communicate any future changes in ABF leadership with the ABF's Pastor and the Pastor of Community
- F. Set overall mood and encourage relational depth.
- G. Set a warm, friendly tone in ABF meeting times.
- H. Be in charge of how class time is used, assuring the teacher of adequate lesson minutes.
- I. Personally, be supportive of all-church values and goals and encourage the ABF to understand and embrace them.
- J. Organize quarterly meetings with the ABF leadership.
